FOUNDATION LEARNING COURSES ARE DESIGNED TO HELP SUPPORT PEOPLE WANTING TO IMPROVE THEIR BASIC SKILLS FOR WORK AND EVERYDAY LIVING. DELIVERED IN A SAFE, SUPPORTIVE AND NURTURING ENVIRONMENT, OUR COMMITTED TEAM OFFERS SPECIALIST SUPPORT TO EACH STUDENT BASED ON THEIR INDIVIDUAL NEEDS.

They include Life Skills, Vocational Skills and Work Skills Programmes, as well as our very own KC Futures course. This course is designed to help students who may have missed part of their education work on their skills and carve out a future that suits them.

Learning support is given to all foundation students on a one-to-one basis and some courses also offer classroom lessons and work placement.

Pre Entry – Entry Level 1, Entry Level 2

Students starting on Entry Level 1 and Entry Level 2 qualifications are usually within our Foundation Learning Department. These qualifications support students in developing their basic skills in English, Maths and ICT. They typically also involve practical tasters in vocational subjects and life skills/work skills development.

Students studying Entry Level qualifications do not take exams; they are assessed by course work or by being observed doing practical tasks.

Entry Level 3 qualifications

Usually for students with GCSE's below Grade 2 in English and Maths. Entry Level qualifications are offered in Maths and English as well as practical subjects such as Construction, Motor Vehicle, Catering, and Hair and Beauty. In practical subjects, they usually will teach the basic skills for that area. Students doing Entry Level 3 qualifications do not always take exams instead they are assessed by course work or being observed doing practical tasks. They usually take one year to complete

Level 1 qualifications

Usually for students with GCSE's Grade 2 or above in English and Grade 1 Maths. Level one qualifications provide an introduction to a subject area and are available in a wide range of work-related subjects. In very practical subjects you would usually start at this level as you will not have the skills required to join at a higher level. Students studying a Level 1 will usually be assessed by course work, completing set practical tests, and for some courses on-line multiple-choice question assessments. They usually take one year to complete and you would be awarded a pass or fail

STUDY PROGRAMMES AND CURRICULUM CONTENT

Our framework for purposeful learning

- Individual, person-centred approach to teaching, learning, and assessment, reflecting the four pathways of preparation for adulthood
- Our curriculum focuses on Art Design and Craft attainment and qualifications. Functional skills such as English, Maths, Communication and ICT are embedded throughout each individual study programme. Where students aged 16-18, and 19-25 with an EHC Plan, have not attained the required grades in English and Maths, our study programmes will comply with the ESFA condition of funding regulations.
- Engage Inc. is our full time creative learning framework, giving access to level 2 and 3 qualifications, over 1 or 2 years, with work experience.



Ravenshall post 16

POST 16 CRITERIA – RAVENSHALL

Ravenshall School's post 16 provision is designed for young people who are not yet ready or able to attend a mainstream supported college course or other appropriate post 16 provision in Kirklees.

These young people are likely to have already have accessed a Complex Needs provision pre- 16.

Students will have an EHCP/Statement. Students will be accessing the curriculum at a minimum of Level 1, with an upper limit of Level 3 Entry Level.

The young person's destination is Further Education and/or training, and it is expected that this can be achieved within the next 2 years.

Despite intensive intervention around the young person's areas of need, progress has been very limited and there is supporting evidence to demonstrate this.

Students will also meet these criteria: • An inability to self-regulate to a degree that will enable them to function in a college environment

• A lack of resilience to a degree that prevents them from managing independently in different situations • Are likely to have significant social and emotional immaturity, e.g. functions below 5 years socially and emotionally and there is evidence to support this

Extreme levels of anxiety that are evident day to day • Significantly impaired sense of social appropriateness

• A lack of independent living skills

• Unpredictable behavior / lack of a sense of danger that places the young person or other at risk

• The young person is at risk of CSE, bullying or exploitation in general.



16 – 19 provision (Preparation for Adulthood), which supports a small group of more vulnerable pupils from across other Kirklees special schools, who are not yet ready to move on to Kirklees College or other post 16 providers.

These young people continue to develop their learning in literacy and numeracy whilst experiencing a wide range of confidence building activities in order to develop their social skills in readiness for moving on to a college setting, further training or employment at the end of Year 13.

The curriculum on offer includes a range of off-site learning environments, where learners meet with members of the public, learners from other provisions as well as accessing specialist centres

RYEBURN VALLEY

Most of the students at Ryburn make expected or above progress for their age, but a few have difficulties and need extra support.

This could include difficulties with communication and interaction; cognition and learning; social, emotional and mental health; sensory difficulties with sight or hearing; or physical difficulties.

In all these cases, there are ways we can support students to enjoy learning and to reach their potential.

As a school we aim to:

ensure that all pupils have access to a broad and balanced curriculum

build on each pupil's strengths



Provide a differentiated curriculum and support provision appropriate to an individual's needs and ability

Identify all pupils requiring SEND provision as early as possible in their school career, including effective liaison with previous primary school.

teachers are trained and supported by our SEND specialists to differentiate to the specific needs of students.

Support is tailored, and we have a range of strategies and facilities inside and outside of mainstream classes.

From intensive literacy support to a pass to leave classes before the rush, we do what it takes to help.



SKILLS FOR LIVING

Learning is broader than the curriculum, and some of our students need a little extra help with skills that will help them gain independence. We run courses in life skills and vocational skills at Key Stage 4 and 5. We also work with a travel trainer who can help students learn to navigate public transport with confidence.

AN INCLUSIVE AND ACCESSIBLE SCHOOL

We go out of our way to give students the emotional and practical support they need to feel happy at school, follow a broad and balanced curriculum and make progress.

For example, our access and literacy centres are a "Safe Haven" for students outside of lesson times. We support students to access school trips and extra-curricular activities, and run clubs including Disport.

WOODLEY SCHOOL AND COLLEGE

Woodley College is a College for Autistic young adults aged 16-19. Woodley College is a five day Monday to Friday provision.

We have two pathways in Woodley College. These are-
